4TH ANNUAL NUEVA GENERACION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



\$60,000 AWARDED TO CHILDREN OF FARMWORKERS THROUGHOUT THE STATE

The Nueva Generación Scholarship Program provides financial assistance to qualifying students from farmworker families in California pursuing higher education. This year, 40 students received a total of \$60,000 in scholarships, reflecting CFF's commitment to improving the lives of these families. Since 2016, over \$250,000 has been awarded to more than 180 recipients statewide - most of which are first-generation of their families to attend college.

New Location! Huron Family Resource Center

Proudly Serving the Community of Huron Since September 2024

In 2024, CFF partnered with the Coalinga-Huron School District to establish the Family Resource Center (FRC) in Huron. Access to essential resources is crucial for small rural communities like Huron and its surrounding areas. The FRC plays a vital role in providing much-needed support services to community members at no cost. Key services offered include monthly mobile health clinics and food distribution initiatives. Furthermore, the center assists with document translation, public benefits enrollment, and digital literacy programs.







GRANT OVERVIEW

In 2024, 74% of CFF's operations were funded by grants. Below are the deliverables from our grant partners across three initiatives.

HEALTH GRANTS

Rural mobile health clinics: served over 1,500 farmworkers in Fresno, Kern, and Tulare counties, addressing healthcare access barriers such as transportation and cost. They offered crucial services like chronic disease screenings and vaccinations, promoting health equity and improving outcomes for farm-working families.

Community Outreach and Education: Our outreach education efforts reached over 20,000 individuals with vital information on nutrition, chronic health conditions, and the importance of vaccinations.

Nutrition Program: A five-week nutrition education program was delivered to **51** participants in small groups of fewer than **10**, focusing on healthy eating habits, food preparation, and overall wellness.

EDUCATION GRANTS

Workforce Development: Successfully up-skilled over 300 farmworkers to meet agricultural industry demands, with participation from more than 40 employers. Outreach efforts reached 3,500 farmworkers, raising awareness of available resources and opportunities.

Scholarship Program: Awarded **40** scholarships to deserving individuals who are children of farmworkers to pursue their educational goals. Since 2016, CFF has awarded over \$250K in scholarships.

Financial Literacy: Over **350** farmworkers gained vital financial education, enabling informed financial decision-making. Outreach efforts reached over 6,000 individuals, boosting financial awareness and promoting economic resilience in farm-working communities.

CIVIL ASSISTANCE GRANTS

Community Engagement & Outreach: Our team engaged over 90,000 farmworkers, providing crucial information on utility assistance and discount programs to help families save costs. We also connected community members with public benefits and promoted climate initiatives, such as water conservation, enhancing environmental sustainability and community resilience.

Public Benefits: In Spring 2024, we initiated the Public Benefit Enrollment Program to enhance access to health benefits for underserved communities. Funded by Kaiser, this pilot program assists with enrollment and navigating complex systems.

Family Resource Center Pilot: In Fall 2024, CFF launched it's first Family Resource Center in Fresno County serving as a one-stop hub, connecting families to a variety of essential services including public benefits, educational resources and community support programs.
